# Code of Conduct Students

### Academic freedom

- We ask questions when we don't understand another person.

• We take responsibility for our environmental footprint and work to promote a sustainable and environmentally friendly university.

### Contribute to social safety

- We actively contribute to creating a socially safe study and work environment.
- We are accountable for our behaviour and respect each other's boundaries.
- We try to <u>discuss or report</u> signs of undesirable behaviour.
