Impact case: Leadership in turbulent times

Professors Harry Garretsen and Janka Stoker reach large and diverse audiences with their expertise and research on leadership. In 2018, their first Dutch book 'Goede leiders zweven niet' (translates to English as: 'Good leaders don't levitate') was published. They were then also asked to become columnists at Het Financieele Dagblad (the Dutch Financial Times). These columns formed the fundament of their second book, written for managers, policymakers and the general public, called 'Goede leiders in onzekere tijden' ('Good leaders in turbulent times'). This book, published in 2022, got lot of attention in the Dutch media, and was the reason to start a podcast on leadership in uncertain times. In his research at FEB, Hagen Kruse focuses on topics of macroeconomic development. Part of his PhD research, on structural change in developing countries, is already mentioned in a report of the World Bank and another of his projects serves as background to a forthcoming World Bank report. Now, on the brink of completing his PhD, Hagen has secured a job as an economist at the World Bank head-quarters in Washington, D.C.
